Criteria for evaluation of participants' chanting performance in individual centers (Regionals)

Definition of terms

Pronunciation is the ability to chant the verses correctly according to the pronunciation rules of Sanskrit.

**Memory** is the ability to chant the assigned/specified verses fluently without any break, long pause or hesitation. *Note:* If a participant is unable to recollect the next quarter or word, he or she can request a prompt from the judge panel, in the preliminary or regionals event. This shall be considered as a memory lapse. Repeating a word or phrase during chanting shall be considered as a **fluency** lapse. Pronunciation of the first attempt will be used for evaluation in cases of such repetitions.

**Correctness of text** is to evaluate if the text of the verses being chanted matches the reference hand-out provided by Chinmaya Mission for this event. Secondly, in cases where a prompt or clue is given, this is to evaluate if the participant can recall and chant the required verses correctly.

<u>Note:</u> The hand-out published in <u>Chinmaya Mission West webpage</u> shall be used as the baseline for validating text and pronunciation. Common pronunciation challenges and guidelines for correct pronunciation of Sanskrit Text can be found in the Chanting Guide provided in the Reference Documents section of this webpage.

**Presentation** refers to the clarity and loudness of chanting, and consistency in speed, during chanting. Adhering to the respective meter (chandas/vṛttam), and chanting fluently following sandhi rules, shall also be evaluated in Presentation. The handout provided for the chapter has the verses split in to four quarters, based on the meter.

Overall effect refers to the devotional attitude (bhāva), confidence in chanting and conduct of the participant during chanting.

**Note:** Tune shall not be a criterion for judgment.

Every participant is required to chant the assigned number of verses as specified in the <u>verse assignment table</u>, in order to be evaluated. Please refer to the <u>Appendix</u> for expected opening and closing.

Scoring criteria (rubric) for Preliminary Round, also referred to as Regionals are as follows:

1. **Kaunteya** - participants from grades 10-12 reading the verses:

Participants in the above two reading groups are required to explain the meaning of one of the proposed set of verses in 3-5 minutes. Please refer to the footer section of the verse assignment table, for the verses proposed for Talks, this year. Recommended reference books are: 1) "The Holy Geeta," and 2) Bhagavad-gītā Chapter 5 commentary, by Swami Chinmayānanda. This is in addition to the chanting.

Each participant in the Regionals shall be awarded a final score out of 100 points by the panel of judges, solely based on their performance. The score awarded by the Judge Panel shall be final. The actual score will not be shared with the participants. Centers may report a Grade: Excellent Performance, Very Good Performance, Good Performance, etc., based on the score.

#### **LEARN GITA INITIATIVE (NEW)**

All students from Grades 1-12 are encouraged to take a vocabulary quiz, either as part of the Regionals, or after the Regionals, based on the vocabulary list provided to the respective grade-group. Please refer to the vocabulary list for Grades 1-2, Grades 3-6, Grades 7-12 published in Chinmaya Mission West webpage.
